Now what?

Congratulations! You have passed your FCC exam and you are now an amateur radio operator. In addition, if you took the "Ham in a Day Class", the Bylaws of the Holland ARC state that anyone who has taken a class from the club, and passed the exam, is a member of the club for one year. You are now also a Holland Amateur radio Club member!

The FCC no longer routinely issues paper licenses, mailed to you. Your actual license should be issued by the FCC within the ten days.

To search for your record:

- 1. Go to http://wireless2.fcc.gov/UlsApp/UlsSearch/searchAmateur.jsp
- 2. You will then get the search form. Go down to the >Licensee light blue box, and in the name box, type in your last name. Then add your zip code. Then click on the enter button on the right.
- 3. If you get a match, you will see your name along with your call sign. If a call sign is there, you are free to go on the air?
- 4. Click on your new call and you will get a page with all the FCC information about you and your license. If you click on the link towards the top called "reference Copy", you can print off a copy of your license.
